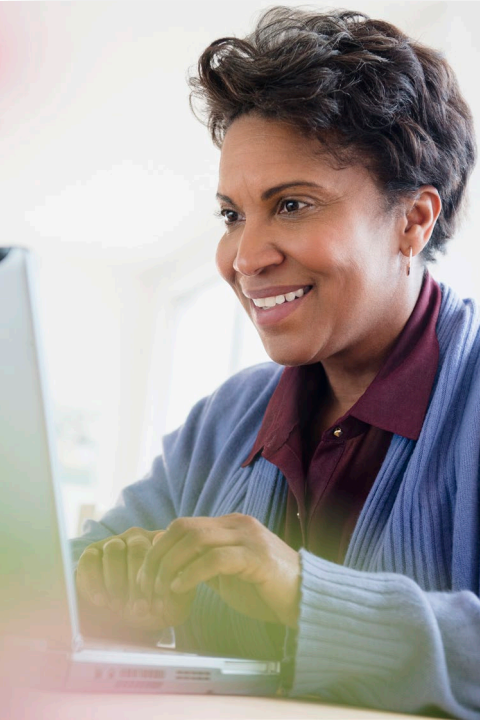

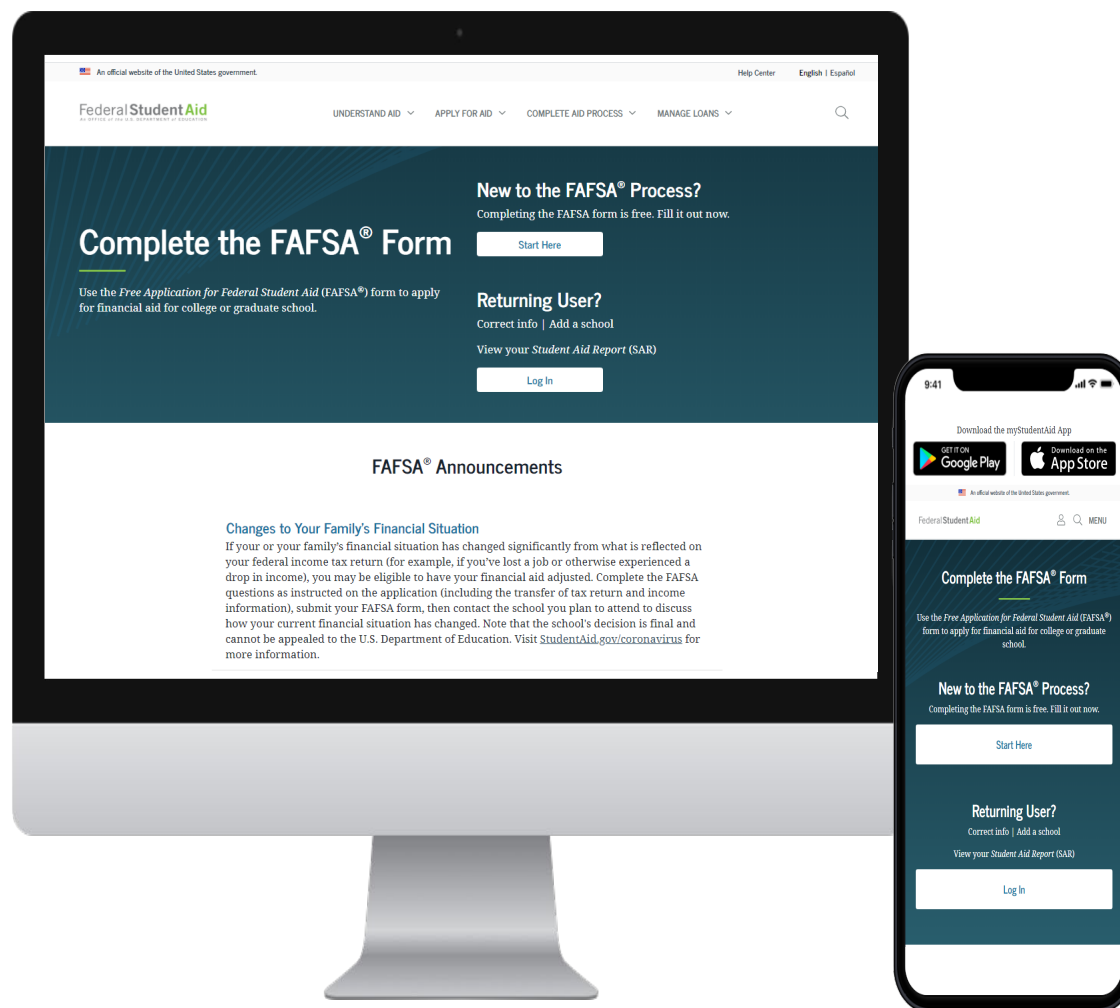

# 2021-22 FAFSA® Updates

THE 2021-22 FAFSA® FORM WILL LAUNCH OCTOBER 1, 2020 AND CAN BE COMPLETED VIA FAFSA.GOV OR THE MYSTUDENTAID MOBILE APP.



# Schedule 1 Question Update



*THE SCHEDULE 1 QUESTION IN BOTH THE PARENT FINANCIALS AND STUDENT FINANCIALS SECTIONS OF THE FAFSA FORM HAS BEEN REVISED.*

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The answer to the “Did you/your parent file a Schedule 1 with the IRS Form 1040?” can now be transferred by the IRS if the user utilizes the IRS DRT.

The instructions on how to answer the Schedule 1 question in the event the applicant does not use the DRT have also been updated to provide additional clarity when answering the question

Did (or will) you file a **Schedule 1** with your **2019 tax return**? **Answer “No”** if you did not file a Schedule 1 or only filed a Schedule 1 to report: unemployment compensation, educator expenses, IRA deduction, student loan interest deduction, Alaska Permanent Fund dividend, or virtual currency.

# FSA ID

The FSA ID is a username and password combination.  
You use it to log into our websites and to electronically sign our forms

## Create a New FSA ID

An FSA ID is a username and password that gives you access to Federal Student Aid's online systems and can serve as your legal signature.

Only create an FSA ID using your own personal information and for your own exclusive use. You are not authorized to create an FSA ID on behalf of someone else, including a family member.

You are not allowed to have an employee or agent of a commercial entity, or other third party, create an FSA ID for you for any purposes including but not limited to: payment reductions, debt consolidation or applying for aid. Misrepresentation of your identity to the federal government could result in criminal or civil penalties.

*Important: When you are done, select the CANCEL button to clear your data even if you did not finish creating your FSA ID. Just closing your browser window or going to another website may not be enough to prevent other people using this computer from seeing your information until the session expires.*


# FAFSA Navigation







## Changes on the 2021–22 FAFSA® Form

The 2021–22 FAFSA changes include the following:

- The income threshold for an automatic zero Expected Family Contribution (EFC) increased from \$26,000 to \$27,000 for the 2021–22 award year.
- When students and parents use the IRS Data Retrieval Tool (DRT), the IRS DRT will now transfer information about whether they filed a Schedule 1. The answer will be based on all current exceptions for filing a Schedule 1. The transferred data for the Schedule 1 fields will be masked.
- For students and parents who don't use the IRS DRT, the Schedule 1 help topics will be updated to include all current exceptions for filing a Schedule 1. "Capital Gains" has been removed as an exception and "Virtual Currency" has been added as an exception.
- Many FAFSA help topics referencing financial forms now feature images of those forms with relevant line numbers highlighted.

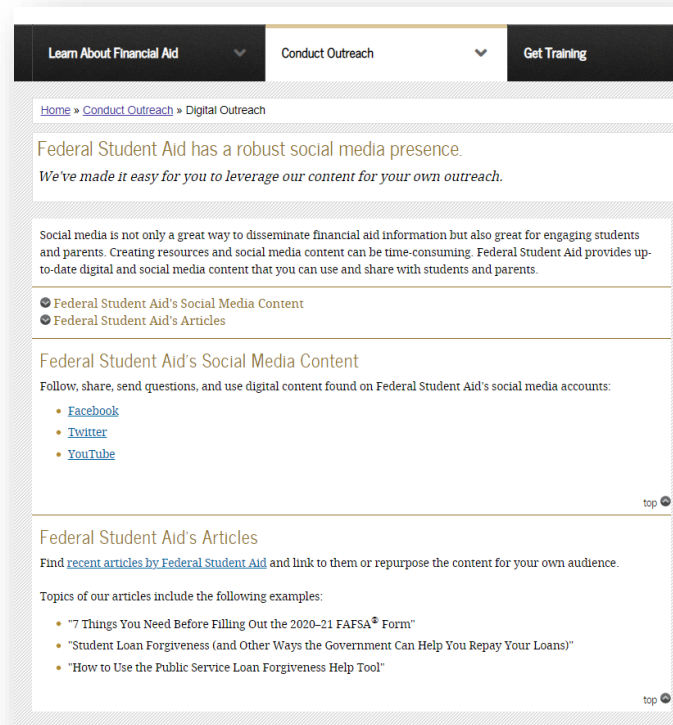

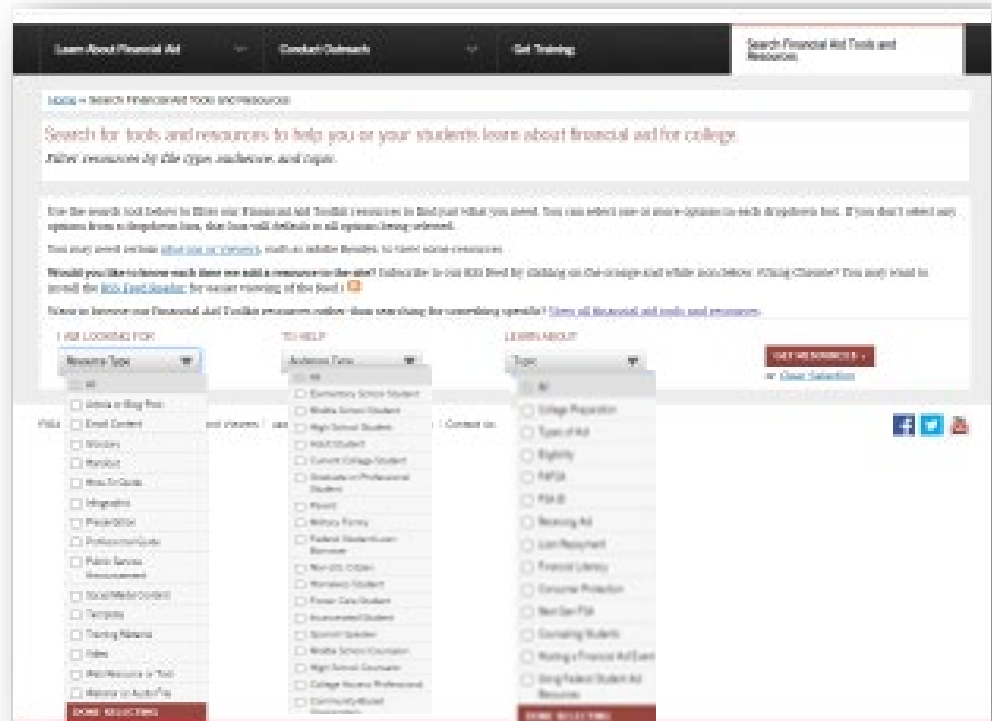

- Ask the admissions or financial aid staff at a local college if someone is available to speak.
- Find out if there's a college access organization near you that can provide an expert in the topic you want to feature. (Invite them to bring their students to your event so they can benefit as well.)

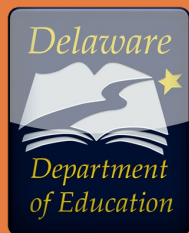

- Delaware was 8<sup>th</sup> in the nation for 2020-2021 FAFSA completion among 12<sup>th</sup> grade students
- 53% of Delaware public and charter school seniors completed a 2020-2021 FAFSA
- For the 2021-2022 academic year the FAFSA completion date for Delaware Higher Education Office scholarship is April 15, 2021, or earlier

  - All three memorial scholarships cover full tuition, fees, room, board and books at UD or DSU
- Diamond State Scholarship - approximately 40 awarded each year, can be used at any college
  - Award amount is \$1,250 per year

# Scholarship Incentive Program (ScIP)

- Approximately 1000 awarded each year at \$1,000 each
- There is now an online application for this award
  - FAFSA must be completed by April 15, 2021
  - All other application steps by June 15, 2021

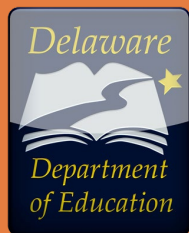
