Terms to Know

✓ Active Duty vs. Reserve:

Active Duty is where a person works for the military full time, may live on base, and can be deployed at any time. The Reserves is where a person is trained and qualified and available for active duty. Reserves do not work full time for the military. They are required to participate in training drills one weekend a month and two weeks per year. Each military branch has a reserve component.

✓ Basic Training:

Basic training or boot camp prepares military recruits for all elements of service: physical, mental, emotional. Each of the Services has its own training program, tailoring the curriculum to the specialized nature of its role in the Military.

✓ ASVAB:

The Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery (ASVAB) is a timed multi-aptitude test. Your scores on the ASVAB will determine how qualified you are for certain military occupational specialties (MOS) and enlistment bonuses. A high score will improve your chances of getting the specialty/job and signing bonus you want.

√ National Guard:

The National Guard includes both the Air National Guard and the Army National Guard. The guard supports combat missions overseas and routinely responds to domestic emergencies such as natural disasters.
