Some colleges require or recommend that students self-report their high school courses, grades and test scores through the Self-Reported Academic Record.

Unofficial transcript: Use a copy of your unofficial transcript when filling out the form to ensure accuracy. **Deadline:** If your college requires the SRAR, you must complete it before the

How to submit the SRAR

- **1. Connect your account:** Log in to your college's Online Applicant Portal. In the portal, find the button, link or step on an application checklist to connect the SRAR form with your application.
- 2. Fill out the SRAR: Complete the form after connecting the SRAR with your account. Carefully enter all your high school courses, grades and test scores. Review the information for accuracy. Hit "submit" when the form is complete.
- 3. Link your SRAR to each application: If you have completed the SRAR previously, you must link it to each of your college application portals. Click "submit" at the end of the SRAR for each college application.

Additional tips

Accuracy: Double-check all information against your unofficial transcript to avoid errors.

- Updates: If your grades or courses change after submitting the SRAR, update the information as required by colleges.
- Support: If you encounter problems, contact the college's admissions office for assistance.
