Meet with your school counselor.

Meeting with your school counselor regularly ensures you're on track to achieve your postsecondary goals.

Create a résumé.

Take the time to create a great **résumé**. It will be a record of your academic accomplishments, extracurricular activities, volunteerism and work experiences since you started high school.

Apply for scholarships.

Use the DSS **Delaware Scholarship Compendium** to find and apply for scholarships. Check monthly for new opportunities.

Finalize Your List of Colleges.

Use the DSS **"Make Your College List"** organizer to narrow down your top 4-8 college choices that match your needs.

Attend Career and College Fairs.

Attend career and college fairs in-person or virtually.

Contact your references.

Provide a brag sheet and/or résumé to those you asked to write your letter(s) of recommendation at least one month before your first application deadline. Remember to send thank you notes.

Apply to College

Begin applying to 8-10 colleges that are a best fit for you. Use the DSS **"How to Apply to College Guide"** to help you through the application and admissions journey. Take advantage of the DSS Application **Fee Waivers** to apply to over 40 colleges for free.

Submit standardized test scores

Reminder: Decide if you should submit **your standardized test scores** to your colleges. Some schools have test-optional policies. Learn more **here**.
